- (1) In the 1860 census of Surry County, NC, James A. ("Jim") Butcher and his family were living in Nixon's District, and shown as tenant farmers. It is thought he was working for Ambrose Jones. He enlisted 5 June 1861, as a Private in Company "H," 21st Regiment, NC Troops. He was present or accounted for until captured at or near Winchester, VA, on or about 25 May 1862. He was confined at Fort Delaware, DE, until exchanged at Aiken's Landing, James River, VA, 5 August 1862. He returned to duty before 17 September 1862 at which time he was wounded in the right arm at Sharpsburg, MD. Consequently the right arm was amputated and he was discharged 12 August 1863. He returned to Surry County and was a farmer in the Zephyr Community for the remainder of his life.
- (2) She was residing with her son Adolphus Winfield Butcher in Mount Airy Township on the 1900 Surry County, NC, census. The birth-years of many of her children are in disagreement, and these shown here reflect their ages on the various censuses. She was still living when her son T. Byrd Butcher was married in 1906.

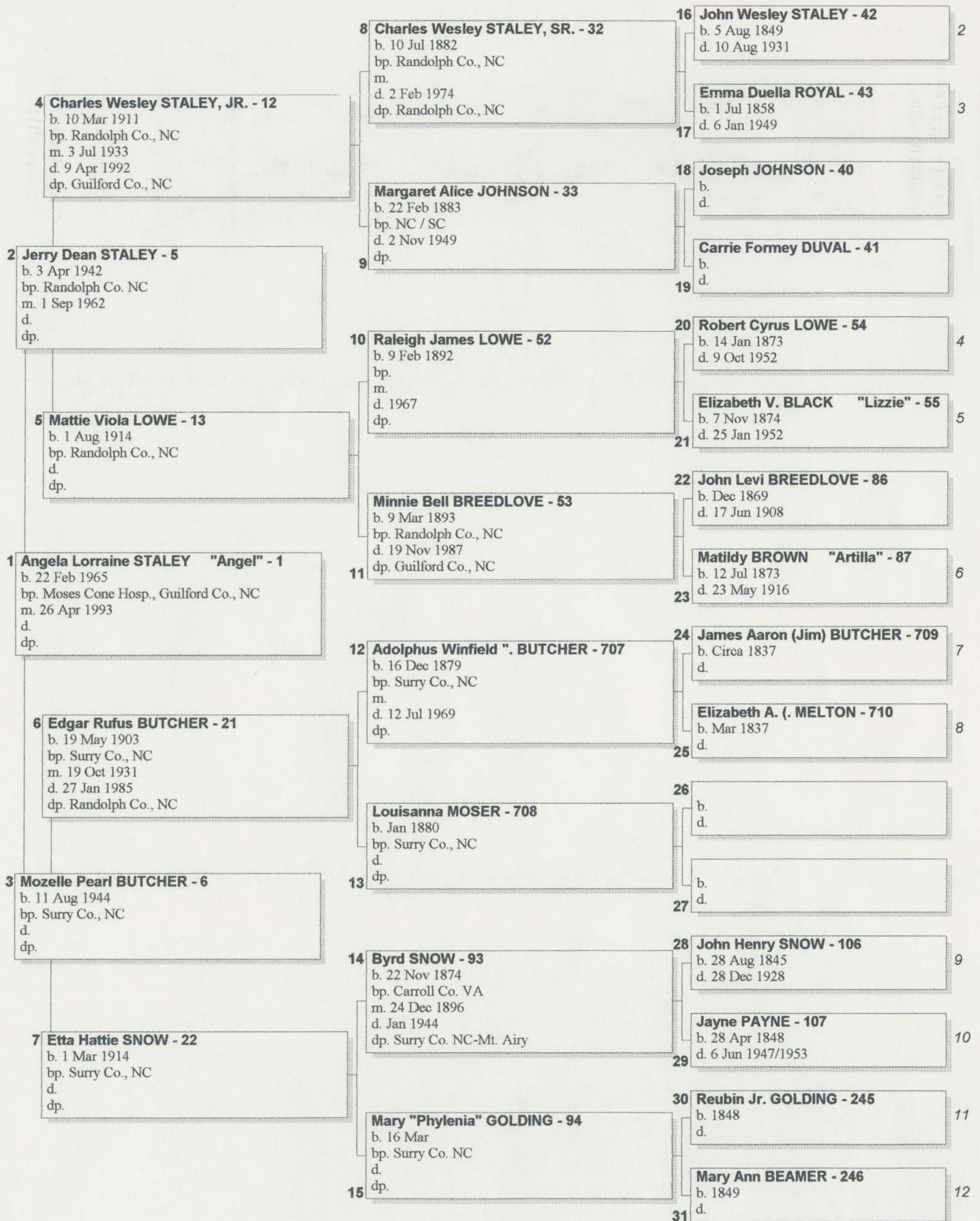
