

We started the year off by electing class officer, and our president, Shirley Waugh, got things off to a good start with the help of our teacher. We sold magazines, Christmas cards, and other profit making items in order to finance one of the most important events of the year; the Junior-Senior Banquet. This was held April 11, at the Robert E. Lee Hotel in Winston-Salem. Everyone had a wonderful time and will long remember that momentous occasion.

In September 1952, twenty-four students returned for their final year of school under the guiding hand of Miss Simpson. We dignified seniors were fully aware of the tasks ahead of us; electing class officers, selecting caps and gowns, preparing for graduation, and most important, the publishing of our yearbook, the "Plainsman." We selected our annual staff of fourteen students, and the remaining eleven students presented the senior play, "Amazing Gracie," which was given November 28. All the seniors went about their duties willingly and enthusiastically.

The Junior-Senior Banquet was another wonderful event of our last year in school. The Juniors really gave us a treat and everyone had a grand time! The Junior-Senior Banquet of '53 will be long remembered by the entire Senior Class.

Graduation was upon us before we knew it! We could hardly realize that we, the class of 1953 were ready to make our departure from White Plains High School. On May 29,1953, twenty-four dignified seniors marched up the aisle of the White Plains auditorium and received their diplomas. We had completed our twelve school years, and were now prepared to either go to college or go out into the world and seek our life's vocation.




