
Thank you for the information thus far received. It is disappointing that there is no more conclusive proof. However, the first brush doesn't always signal the final results.

I have obtained your name from the North Carolina State Library in response to my inquiry for persons willing to perform genealogical research for a fee.

My specific objective is to confirm or deny a connection between one Lemon Dunn of Edgecomb Co., N. C. and a Lemon Dunn found in the 1850 census of Monroe Co. Alabama.



In the North Carolina State Library are two books on the Dunn family. They are: "Dunn and Allied Families"; Creasy, 1937 and "A Registry of the Decendents of James Leonidas Dunn and Dorothy Marian Arrington"; Alston, 1959. The latter book may be important because James Leonidas Dunn b. 14 Mar 1838, d. 9 May 1887 is a son of Burwell or Burrell Dunn and Lucinda Draugham. Burrell is listed as a son of Lemon Dunn & Mary Ann Wilkinson and a receiver in the division of the estate.

Your assistance will be greatly appreciated and I look forward to hearing from you giving me your conditions for doing the research that I am requesting.

Dear Mr. Dunn,

Let me start by advising you not to get excited - I have proven absolutely nothing as far as I have gone on this search.

Have for you the "Estate Papers of Lemon Dunn" of Edgecomb County, N.C. and those for "John Dunn, son of John Dunn." Interesting, but, of no use to you without any mention of Lemon Dunn.

In Edgecomb County I have called for Estates for the Dunns, Sessums and the Wilkinsons. Found no daughters named Ann or Mary Ann or any mention of Dunn grandchildren etc. Also called for Wills, & Guardianships - 0 -

Checked into the Colonial Records by Clark hoping to prove something from the book I copied for you. I am told that Mr. Johnson does a lot of his work from "Tradition". Perhaps you will understand that better than I do at this time. ~~Perhaps that would be the best place to find the address of the person who represented the books and where proofs can be found. Don't mention my name or he will know where the address came from etc.~~

In Halifax County I also called for Estates, Wills & Guardianships for Dunn, Sessions and Kinsey. -0- again. There was an earlier Sessions - Elmore in 1817. Also checked Halifax Will and Estate Index Book.

Read Edgecomb Abstracts of Estates, 1720-1820 and 1820-1850.

Re: The "Bible Records of Early Edgecomb, N. C." entry. More often than not, when there are two entries for the same name, it means that the first person died and the name was used once more. On occasion you will find that the same name is used twice in a family. Because there is no mention of the first Lemon in the estate records of Lemon Dunn, I would suspect that the first son named Lemon died. However, I found no record of such. A young child would not have an estate so there is no reason for a record of the death.

I looked at the 1850 Ala. census hoping to find something you missed. There wasn't a thing more than what you had recorded. Do you have any idea of the relationship of Mary, aged 20? Do you suppose she is the mother of the two younger children? Isn't it strange that there are no other records on the 1840 and 1860 census. Have you read the records of the children in later years? Do they stick with the born in Ala. record? What do they say about their children birth state? Did any of them live into the 1880s?

Do you have any of their middle names?

Lemon S. Dunn married Georgiana V. Gallin in 1851 in Iredell Co., N.C.  
(son of ????)

I have notes on the Edgecomb Co. marriage bonds. There is nothing related to any of the people listed in the little book etc. etc. The earliest is for Jacob M. Polly Pitt in 1818.

I note that there is a Lemmon listed in the Georgis 1850 c.i. I didn't run the film and read. Rand. Co.

In S.C. there is Burrell listed in Sumpter County - 371 and William on 368. Perhaps it would be good to look at these two entries for the mens ages and to look into the county a little further hoping that Lemon came from that group. No Lemon in N.C. 1850, Ala. 1830 and 1840, as you must know.

The 1840 census in Monroe Co. Monroe was formed from Creek & Cherokee Cessions. We have a book on the marriages recorded in that territory (?) - No Lemon Dunn. A William in 1843, Susan in 1875, S. E. in 1868 etc.

In the Edgecomb Deed Indices Lemon first appears in 1809 and continues until after 1835. There is no way to separate this one Lemon from any other without an in-depth study. It is spelled Lamon in the deeds. Lemmon S. appears in 1845 and is still there in 1855, where I stopped reading the index.

The larger portion of the time spent was used in trying to find a parent for Lemon. I imagine that there is something in the Isle of Wight material here in the library that might help to support Hugh Johnsons theory, but, did not have any time to get into that item.

What I strongly suggest is that we try once more to find further information in Ala. and wherever you have record of the family later. All this in order to go back!!!!

It is always somewhat depressing to prove that there is no record on a line. Do hope that something will break later for you.

Have you tried the LDS Church records. Perhaps someone has done something there that might help you.

I would like to meet with you at the State Archives Building, 109 East Jones Street, (the Search Room, Archives Branch, Division of Archives and History, Department of Cultural Resources) Wednesday morning on October 2, to look at any Revolutionary War records to possibly locate my ancestor, Daniel Dunn.

I am enclosing a LSD family group sheet and the first two pages of the Dunn family portion of Olga Edward's "The Connection in East Tennessee". Daniel Dunn served in the Revolutionary War and was granted 200 acres in Washington County, Tennessee in 1783 by North Carolina. He sold this land in 1788. I would like to find the unit Daniel Dunn served in during the Revolutionary War and where he lived prior to migrating to Tennessee (possibly Albermarle, North Carolina).

ther's death. He took care of his mother until her death in 1803. The wife and children of Anderson Walker are not known but the census records indicate that both he and his brother John had families. The 1850 census of Greene Co. gives two families headed by Anderson Walkers. One was probably the son of John and other the son of Anderson Walker Sr.

MRS. MICHAL BLEU DAU. OF JOHN WALKER SR.

- 703 (432) A daughter of John Walker Sr. married MICHAL BLEU. This is all we know but much research has been conducted in an effort to locate some data about them. Bleu is one form of Billue. Research indicates that Michael is a common name in the Billue family.

## THE DUNN FAMILY

- 704 DANIEL DUNN SR. is the 1st progenitor of the Blount Co. Dunns of whom we can be sure at this time. He may have been the son of a Levi Dunn who in 1794 bought 150 acres in Rockbridge Co., Va. from James DAUGHERTY. The land, a part of Bordens grant, was sold by Levi Dunn on 2-7-1806 to Gabriel PENDAL. (Levi Dunn Sr. son of Daniel Dunn Sr. was only 9 years old in 1794 and too young to have been a party to this transaction.) The Levi Dunn of Rockbridge could have been a brother of Daniel Dunn Sr.

Daniel Dunn Sr. was born 6-7-1761 according to his family Bible. Rhoda his wife was born 9-22-1759 and they married 1-30-1781. Their deaths are also recorded in the Bible. Daniel died 3-25-1822 and Rhoda died 8-25-1821. They probably died in Greene County, Tenn. as court records there show that on 1-20-1824 the estate of Daniel Dunn was sold by his executor Levi Dunn. Daniel Dunn's Bible record which will be given contains some vague entries. After the son Daniel Jr.'s birth date is written "Had Rhoda," then follows the birth dates of twins James and William who died the same month. Rhoda may have been a twin of Daniel Jr. or this may have referred to Daniel Jr.'s eldest daughter. The entry, of Anne and William Dunn may also record the birth of twins.

Mary Alice Byrd Dunn who did research on this family states that Daniel Dunn Sr. and Rhoda were married in Albemarle, Va. We were unable to certify this as some of their records were destroyed in a court house fire. She also found on the Pittsburg Pay Rolls in the Virginia State Library that Daniel Dunn Sr. served 55 days in Capt. George McCulloch's Co. during the Revolutionary War. He did not apply for a pension. One informant says he was born in Henrico Co., Va. but gives no source.

Daniel Dunn Sr. evidently came early to Washington County (later a part of Wash. Co. was Greene Co.) as he was selling land in 1788 on the waters of the Watauga that had earlier been granted to him. He was still there and selling land in 1796. A Daniel Dunn who was infirm was



excused from paying taxes in Wash. Co., Tenn. in 1781. Several of Daniel Dunn Sr.'s children were married in Greene County. Apparently all of them moved to Blount County, Tenn. and it is quite probable that Daniel Sr. and Rhoda came also.
