Dear Dee,

I shall start out right here at the beginning telling you that I have not been able to add to your information on the Chambky families despite some good time spent in trying to do so.....

To start, I turned in call slips at the desk asking for wills end or estates for seven different spellings in Anson, Rowan, Iredel, Cabarrus, Orange, Duplin and Gjranville. Very little came of that. I remember two estates from Orange Co. in the mid 1850s. Nothing that relates.

Read in the microfilm room the indices to both Grantor and Grantee Deeds for the following: Anson, Iredell, Cabarrus, Richmond, Stokes & Surry.

In the 1785-7 state census noted Chambless in Granville, Duplin & Surry Co. In 1790 the names seem to be Chambley, Shamley & Chamling in Richmond, Wake, Surry Cos. 1800 c.i. shows Chambly in Rowan Cjc, Chamlee in Wake, Chamler(Clabourn) in Anson, Chamless in Buncombe, Shambles in Stokes and Surry and Shambling in Stokes.

The marriage bond index shows a few of the different spellings. Again, nothing that fits at this time.

Have you checked the DAR Pension book for the name? Is there no probate record in Del. Co. Ind.?

At this time the only thing I can think of to search would be the court and tax records of Iredell Co., N.C. It takes about an hour to read the court minutes.....for one year. You can scan read them a little faster. I see that their records suffered from a fire and tarn't complete. What there are should be checked to be sure that northing is missed.

Do you/have the N.C. Archives "Guide to Research Materials in the N.C. State Archives?? The cost is \$8 and it is from the Archives Search Room. Lists all of the County Records. This and Leary & Stirewalds book, North Carolina Research give you the best picture of what ibould be done researching N.C.

You had an ink blot on your letter. Heaven only knows what I have in this one. I am busy getting used to my new IBM Personal Typewriter - a portable so that I can take it camping this Easter weekend and then when we go west this summer I can take it along and work on my transcriptions while we are sitting about in the evenings. It is a portable and should fit in the Minnie Winnie without taking up the complete space allotted to me!!!

Must get on with another report. Perhaps I will have a chance to talk to you this summer. Have been thinking about offering N.C. advice to Gene. Soc. members on a individual basis but, have decided to let that go. Will only have a few hours while in Spokane with the family planning different things. 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I have had lots of problems with my Shamley/Chambly line, no one has been able to agree on the spelling of the name even.

1 located William and Chloe Chamley Gard in Delaware county Ind., followed them to Linn county lowa, there in the hisoty of Linn county I found that Chloe's father's name was Richard Chamley, it said of Wayne Co. Ind., I spent months trying to locate something in WAyne Co., finally went to land records and found the were by then in Kosciusko Co. Ind., they had lived in Delaware county, sold the land and moved to Kosciusko county according to land records. Chloe stated in the 1850 census she was born in North Carolina, according to the same census Richard Chamley and his family all said they were born there also. I found Richard in Iredell, county N. C. in the 1820 census. I could not find him anyplace in the 1830 one. Back to land records.

Iredell Co. said they had no records, 1 #37te to the public library and the librarian worte and told me the page numbers they were on even, so I worte back and got copies. Richard Shumlee bought land from Shadrac Upchurch Oct. 29, 1817, sold it on Oct. 22 1831 to Holdman Morgan, only his name was spelled Richard Chambl) that time. I never did find where he bought land in Del. Co. Indiana, but his son John did. I have lost Richard in Indiana in 1870, was unable to find any of the family again. He was 72 in 1860 so think he mugt have died along with his wife Clarissa by 1870. Am still working on that.

There were Chamley's in Rowan, Anson, Wake and Granville Co's . I wrote to Kowan to see if they had a marriage record for Richard and Clarrissa, they had none in the marriage files, said they had no land entries for Chamley's either. Bas & Page Anson Co. had a Claibourn Chamley, he sold land to John Chamley 7-12-1800 H#2-467 John Chamney to Zachariah Harrel Claborourn Chamney to Samuel Ingram Claybourn Chamberlay bought from Thos. Hooper 2-28-1795 D&E 75

Richard did not buy or seel land in Wake, Kowan or Anson or Orange counties himself but he would have been to yougg I suppose.

Due to the fact that his oldest son, that I know of, was named John I wonder if the John and Claibourn above are my connection?

Mary Chambley is living alone in 1820 cansus, could she possibly be John's widow and the mother of Richard? Who knows.

If I could get back to Salt Lake and go through the records there I may be able to find the answers but I am not going to be able to do that. Last time I was in that paradise - spent allthe time I had on my husband's family anyway.

This is all I have to send you to go on.

Am not rich so let me know when the \$30.00 is gone and then I will decide what to & from there.
