



CALLAHAN — FIRST HOME

Robert and Sarah Frances Callahan had seventeen children in this log house: Columbus, b. 1872; Charlie, b. Dec. 27, 1874; John Hugh, b. Oct. 10, 1878; Mary Jane, b. Sep. 19, 1879; Ardella "Dell," b. June 23, 1881; Fannie, b. May 29, 1884; Thomas, b. Nov. 15, 1885; Louisa, b. June 1, 1888; Benjamin, b. Dec. 24, 1889; Elizabeth "Bet," b. May 6, 1891; Amelia, b. 1894; Matilda, b. Aug. 16, 1896; and William, birthdate not known. (He joined the Standing Army and settled in Oklahoma City where he was buried when he died.) Triplets, died at birth; and another child that did not live long enough to be named.

This first home did not come easy for the Callahans. Robert was the son in the family to serve as a soldier in the Civil War. His brother, Richard, was left to be Home Guard. A Home Guard was a man left in the community to be on the alert for outlaw Rebel troops who would kill and steal for food and shoes. The Rebels were near starvation and some of them would do anything for food. Robert's brother got word to him that their mother was dying. Robert went AWOL (absent without leave) to try to see his mother. Before he could reach home, another Home Guard told him his mother had died. Robert then made his way back to his regiment, only to be told that the war had ended and all of his regiment had gone home. He started his journey back home, travelling by night thinking he might be mistaken for one of the outlaw Rebel soldiers who stole and killed. By this time, he was in rags; he had lost so much weight that even his family members did not recognize him when he got home.

On his way home, Robert Callahan stopped at the Butcher home. The Butchers' father and mother had been killed by outlaw Rebel soldiers. Only Rube, Sarah Frances, and George were left alive in this family. The Butcher children shared food with Robert — they had hidden it under the floor of the house; all their other food had been taken by the outlaw Rebels who killed their parents.

When Robert did reach home, he was wearing rags and covered in body lice. He was not allowed in the house until he was bathed and treated for lice, and his clothes burned.

After he was nursed back to health, he returned to the Butchers' home where he met Sarah Frances. She was 13 years old and Robert was 25; he took her home to be his wife.

Robert and Sarah Frances Callahan's first home (still standing on Simpson Road in Surry County) and its furnishings were built entirely by hand with the help of Robert's family and friends





Eulogy of Carl Randolph "Randy" Golding 3-16-1929 – 12-3-2010 Franklin-Heights United Methodist Church 12-5-2010

From the 41st chapter of Isaiah the 10th verse: "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed: for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness."

From the beginning of the Bible to the end, we have recorded the immeasurable Glory of God revealed and also his great love and amazing Grace. God's word reveals to us that we can place our trust and hope in God and we can have the assurance that in this life and in the eternal life to come, that those who acknowledge him may live in the light of his divine love. Thanks be to God.

We gather on this occasion in worship of God the creator, preserver of life and master of the universe.

We gather in faith, trusting in His love and grace, which is revealed in his goodness, in the blessings of life and in His son Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

We gather with hearts saddened by the passing of Carl Randolph "Randy" Golding, a faithful husband, father father-in-law, grandfather, great grandfather, kinsman, fellow church member, neighbor and friend.

We gather in support of this family in their loss.

Death is as certain as birth, it is a part of our mortality and it comes to everyone.

But we gather also as Christians, confident in the assurance of God that death is not the end of our existence, but rather the entry into a greater and eternal existence which the Lord has prepared for us. God is with us through the all of life. He wants the best for us and through His son Jesus Christ, He has made provision for eternal life for those who acknowledge His lordship and believe on him. Let us give thanks unto him for his goodness towards us.

This life is hard at best. It holds joy as well as sorrow. There are victories as well as failures. Randy experienced both in life. But Randy also knew this; the glory and the wonder of heaven is far better than the best this world has to offer.

Yes we come today in grief, but we also come praising God for his love and goodness which we can count on in all of life's experiences, even the death of a loved one such as Randy.

We also come to commemorate Randy's life and all that he meant to us. Randy was born in Wythe Co., Virginia, the third child of Hobert and Julina Upchurch Dunford.

Randy's parents like many in the early years of the great depression fell upon hard times and by 1931, when Randy was two years old, the family was stricken by financial problems, legal problems and by the separation of the parents, the burden of the mother caring for three small children was too great. Such situations may seem hard for us to understand today but back then were more common.

The decision was made to find a home for the youngest child, where he would have a better life and be provided for. It is believed that Julina Upchurch Dunford, was acquainted with Columbus and Ellen Payne Golding and contact was made regarding Randy's being taken and raised by the Golding family. This was done. Some years later it is said that Randy's natural father, Hobert Dunford, sought to get Randy back but without success.

Randy grew up in the Golding family, where he knew a loving Christian home and was adored by his two teenage sisters, Emma and Ona, who both loved their new baby brother. The Golding family, grew up on a farm in the North Carolina/Virginia Border in Surry County in the Pipers Gap community.

As an older youth the family moved to Mount Airy but continued to farm in the homeplace. Randy attended Franklin Elementary and High School but like many of that time he did not graduate. At the end of World War II he dropped out of high school and helped out on the farm.

At the age of 18 he married his first wife, Ruth Miller Golding, and became a Car Salesman, working at Williams Chevrolet, Collins Chevrolet, and Phillips Motors. All total Randy was a Car salesman for over forty years. Randy and Ruth were the parents of Edward Dale Golding and Rita Golding Jones. Some years later this marriage ended.

Mary Sue, Randy's second wife, tells me that although she had heard of Randy that they first met at the popular, O'Dells Sandwich Shop. Randy was thirty-three and she was nineteen at the time of their meeting. Randy and Mary Sue were married and had two children, Carl Stanley Golding and Janet Golding Rodden.

Randy was a loving husband and a loving father. Those whom he loved knew he loved them and they loved him in return.

After Randy became a member of the Golding family, he like they, attended Imogene Methodist Church. After Randy and Mary Sue were married they like Ona and Emma and their families before them, joined Franklin Heights United Methodist Church, and this was to be their church for approximately forty-five years.

Randy was a respected car salesman and received various honors for his work in this area over his long career, but the appreciation and friendship from his customers were what he valued most. Words such as friendly, courteous, caring, thoughtful, honest and faithful are words that you hear from people in describing Randy. I have been privileged to have known Randy for over forty years and can attest that Randy that these words correctly describe the Randy that I came to know and value.

After Randy was grown, he re-established contact with his Dunford family. Both his mother and father were divorced, remarried and had additional children. Randy appreciated his biological family and knowing them enriched his life, however his being given up, was understandably hard for him to fully comprehend. However there was no question of his love and devotion to the Golding family that he was truly a part of.

In this season of Advent, as we celebrate the gift of Christ, let us understand that this gift was the gift of our loving God and for those who accept this gift, eternal life is certain. Randy knew this. He wanted to live, but he was prepared and unafraid to die because he trusted in God.

I have been told of Randy's nightly prayers, how Randy prayed out loud, for any and all to hear. These were prayers of thanksgiving and love unto God. Now that thanksgiving and love can be said face to face between Randy and God.

Family, in the days ahead when the grief comes and sadness is heavy upon you, draw strength in knowing that God is with you loves you, and is there to help you go on by faith.

A Mothers Remembers...

While I realize that in today's social and political climate the Confederate flag is hardly considered "politically correct," I have nevertheless chosen it to commemorate the life of my son Ben. I make no apology, for I trust that those who might otherwise be offended by this symbol will come to understand what it represents here. For Ben, bewildered by the virtual disappearance of his immediate family, it was a connection to a larger family which helped fill an indescribable void in his life.

Benjamin Duncan was no ordinary young man—and neither were his older brothers Jesse and Scott.

To say that these young men who grew up in the high mountains of North Carolina were adventuresome would not be exactly true. To say that they lived and tested life to its fullest would be more accurate...and it would surely bring smiles to the faces of their friends who participated in their "tests of life." The difference between these three brothers and their friends is that Jesse, Scott, and Ben have all died.

The dwindling away of our family began with a divorce in 1973. Their daddy remained a part of the boys lives, but not part of their household. Like most parents faced with the daunting prospect of raising their children to be responsible adults, I felt overwhelmed. For the task, I drew on the things that were familiar to me.

My family, including my sons, were southerners to the core—not racists or bigots, for these traits are acquired through following examples, and we stood for none of that. I refer to our geographical, social, and cultural roots. I had learned of our ancestors who fought under the Confederate flag, and for me they and the great heroes like General Robert E. Lee were men of honor who were willing to lay down their lives for what they believed.

I couldn't make them academic achievers or give them great skill in athletics, but I could—and I did—teach my sons that a man is judged by his word, that a handshake is binding, that to be honorable is important. I taught them that if they could live their lives in such a way that it would be said of them, "They are honorable men," then God would be pleased—and so would their Mama.

In 1979 tragedy struck. Jesse and Scott were drag racing, and the car in which Jesse was riding hit a narrow bridge. His neck was broken and, at the age of 18, he died in Scott's arms.

Scott's heart and soul died at the same time, but it took his body two years to follow. He was just 19 when he died of a drug overdose.

Now it was just Ben and I. He was 10 when Jesse died, and 12 when he lost Scott—too young to understand why, and too old not to comprehend the permanence of death. Our once raucous household was so still. Together we began a journey to recover from our loss.

We began to study genealogical charts. Ben learned of his ancestral family, and they became important to us. We did, in fact, create for ourselves a sense of large family as we studied about and "got to know" as people some of the names we discovered. One of them was Henry Francis Marler, Co.D, 32nd Division, Virginia Calvary.

Ben's quilt square represents the flag under which this *particular* soldier fought. The soldier was his great-, great-, great-, great-, great-grandpa.

He was an important part of Ben's family.

Even with the sadness that was a part of it, Ben and I enjoyed a wonderful life together. He grew to become a handsome young man—and continued to grow and grow (to almost 6'5"). He was nearing graduation at Clemson University in South Carolina when, in 1990, at the age of 22, he was killed when he lost control of a motorcycle and hit a tree.

Why my children had to die is so very hard to accept. I am so grateful that God has given me the grace and wisdom to understand that He didn't call my sons away from this life—but that He did welcome them home. My sons are dead because of decisions that they themselves made. These were not God's decisions.


I am also thankful that the Organ Procurement Agency of South Carolina asked me to donate Ben's organs. This was something that he and I had discussed when his brothers died, but because of where we lived, it was not possible to do. If I had not been approached about this at the time of Ben's death, I would not have thought of doing it.

Donating the organs is a decision with which Ben would have been in full agreement, and which I can, in my mind, easily attribute to him. Thus, his final decision was a good one—unlike the previous bad decision that cost him his life.

I regret that I was not aware that I could also have made of gift of his bones, and I am certain that I am not alone in my ignorance about bone donation. I hope that this quilt, and the stories associated with it, will help enlighten people about the full scope of opportunities for donations that have such impact. The recipients of these donations are no more blessed than those of us who, in our loss, gain a sense of peace from believing that there was some good derived from our tragedy.

Thank you for the work you are doing.

Dear Mrs. Capell;

On behalf of the South Carolina Organ Procurement Agency I would like to express our sincere sympathy on the loss of your son, Benjamin. I know that this has been an extremely difficult time for you and your husband, and my thoughts have been with you frequently over the past days.

I know that you have already spoken with Nancy Kay regarding the recipients of Benjamin's liver, kidneys, heart valves, and corneas, but wanted to send you this letter anyway, just as I promised. Although nothing will ever be able to replace your son's life, I hope that you will feel some comfort in knowing that he did give life to many others. In fact, a 59 year old father in Los Angeles would have died within a day or so if he had not received his transplant on September 29, 1990. In addition, a 22 year old girl and a 30 year old man will no longer need to rely on dialysis to keep them alive, as both of these South Carolinians were given your son's kidneys. Benjamin's heart valves will be transplanted later this month, and his eyes have given sight to two ladies in South Carolina.

You have been through so much in your lifetime. I cannot begin to imagine what you are feeling after losing your sons. However, I somehow feel that your husband and friends will be a great source of comfort to you in the days to come. Please know that I am always here if I can help in any way. You are a very special family. I only hope that organ donation will somehow help to ease your pain, by knowing that a part of your son still lives on.

The Day was a Beautiful Fall Day

It was November 6, about 10:45 in the morning. It was a happy day, for Isaac Mutua was visiting USA for the first time. The leaves were beautiful and Isaac was overwhelmed for he had never seen colored leaves. Johnnie was explaining how the colors came. There was no warning when a lady named Rose Gibson was turning left into our lane. Her turning light was red . . . She never slowed and hit us <u>head-on</u>.

Johnnie was thrown out of the Suburban from the back seat and onto the pavement. She probably ricocheted off the Chevy pickup that hit us. She had just taken off her seatbelt to put her head thru the two front seats. She did this because Isaac had said something she couldn't hear.

And in just a few seconds . . . Our lives would never be the same again.

When I regained consciousness, I was looking for Johnnie and found her on the pavement with her legs under the body of the Suburban and her head was next to the rear tire where the Suburban had made a 180^o turn around and came to a dead stop about 6" from her head - just as if God said, "No, no, that's far enough."

Johnnie was flown by helicopter to the U. T. Medical Center in Knoxville. She was in pain to the point she was in and out of consciousness, and screaming for Jesus . . . "Please help me, Jesus!!!"

Our brothers and sisters at First Baptist Morristown had already learned of the wreck and were coming to the emergency room at Hamblem County where I was taken by ambulance.

When I was released from the Emergency Room in Morristown, my friend, Dr. Max Brown, drove me to the U. T. Medical Center. This was around 6:00 PM. The ride was forever . . . I knew Johnnie was badly hurt, but couldn't help thinking she was dead.

11-06-06 Johnnie was put in Critical Care for two days, where she was kept in a coma-like state, till they thought it was safe to operate.

The Lord sent Dr. James Ulibarri to the Critical Care and told us, Johnnie had an exploded spinal column at the T-12 location and she would not have the ability to use her bladder or bowels and her spinal cord was severely damaged at the T-12 location. This was after x-rays and MRI's. This was on 11-7-06.

Johnnie would be paralyzed from the waist down.

It is still hard to believe the number of friends that came to be with me at the U. T. Medical Center in Knoxville. It was hard to pray for Johnnie to live knowing she would be paralyzed.

No one who has known Johnnie for five minutes would want her to live paralyzed . . . Most of all . . . Johnnie.

Dr. Ulibarri told us he would operate and put 4 titanium rods - two on her back and then remove her organs, that's what I said - remove all organs, except for one lung and would have to take out some ribs. Then he would put two rods on the inside to stabilize her spine for long term care.

On Wednesday the surgery was done. It took 13 hours and we found that the spinal column was exploded, but God had healed the spinal cord. Thank you God! It is only bruised.

Could this mean no paralyzation . . . Now it would be up to Johnnie and we all know, if it is up to Johnnie for her to walk again . . . And if it takes faith for her to walk again . . . If it takes determination and there is the smallest chance . . . She will walk!

Dr. Ulibarri told me he had put the two longer rods on the inside and had put a titanium basket in the exploded spinal column and put bone grafting from her left hip in the titanium basket. He also collected the bits and pieces from the exploded spinal column and put in the basket. Johnnie thinks her value has increased greatly with the titanium.

The basket will eventually grow bone and fuse the T-11 and the L-1 vertebrae into a single (3) vertebrae bone.

The surgery and surgeons were excellent and of God.

There were three surgical teams:

1 Team: Used regular sutures, cardiac.

1 Team: Used staples, orthopedic spine.

1 Team: Used super glue, vascular.

Johnnie asked if any used Duct Tape?

After three weeks at U. T. Medical Center, Johnnie was to be moved to a skilled nursing home and then when she was physically ready she would go to Patricia Neal Rehabilitation Center in Knoxville.

But she was not at the level required. She was still vomiting all the time from her medications . . . The pain alone was enough.

She was moved to Lakeway Regional Hospital in Morristown. They had a Rehabilitation Center and had a bed for her. We were told Lakeway would take her at the level she was . . . and graduate her out rehabilitated.

This did not happen . . . No where close!!!

Dr Ulibarri gave us hope after the surgery that in time and rehabilitation Johnnie just might be able to walk, perhaps with a walker or cane and he felt sure her bladder and bowels would function.

All this was after God had healed her spinal cord, for it clearly showed on the MRI to be severed. I stood right in front of the screen with Dr. Ulibarri looking at her severed spinal cord. I'm not sure Dr Ulibarri is a Christian . . . If he wasn't before, he should be now. Since, he has told me he did have help!!!!!!

Lakeway Regional was not the place for her and hurt her in ways she is still having to overcome. I believe they were not experienced to treat such a severe injury. The first thing they did was let her fall. It was not a good experience and after three weeks I brought her home.

Just before Christmas things in our home were pitiful. I had a very sick wife who cried all the time, because her pain had never been controlled from the trauma doctors at U. T. Medical Center to the rehabilitation doctors at Lakeway Regional Hospital. It seemed her vomiting was never going to stop.

12-21-06 This morning was so bad . . . Johnnie asked me to help her die. I was at the end of my rope. I had prayed for God to please help me to know what to do.

I was mad for God allowing Johnnie to get hurt in the first place. No one deserved this pain less than my wife.

Johnnie had teams of doctors at U. T. But she did not have a DOCTOR - one doctor did this . . . Another doctor did that - none knew nor cared what was going on with the other doctors.

And then I thought about a nurse practitioner right here in New Tazewell. Johnnie thought a lot of Teresa Rasmussen, so I called the doctor's office she works for, but she was on vacation. Now what can I do?

I called the doctor's office back and talked with a young lady and tried to explain what had been going on. She asked if Johnnie could walk. When I said no - she immediately said to have her there at 1:00 and she would see that "Miss Johnnie", she knew her, saw Dr. Pannocchia first after lunch.

Praise God! At this time, she couldn't walk and used a wheelchair. Dr. Pannocchia looked at Johnnie and I thought he was going to cry. I had not been able to dress her, wash her hair or barely comb her hair. She did not look good.

Dr. Pannocchia had taken care of Johnnie when she had her last blood clot here and told her at that time that he recommended that <u>under no circumstances was she to go to Kenya with a blood clot</u>. <u>Which of course she ignored</u>.

He had never seen her look like this and immediately started asking questions. When I was trying to explain her surgery and all the comp-lications. He knew about everything I was trying so hard to explain.

When he discovered the medications the doctors had prescribed for her he couldn't believe it . . . "ALL" Were known for their nausea and she was taking four. He didn't know how she survived.

Dr. Pannocchia started Home Healthcare and adjusted her medication to keep the pain under better control and stopped the vomiting.

The physical therapist made her do an exercise that caused the basket in her back to break loose from where it had already begun to graft - terrible pain - Dr Ulibarri said it set her back about three months. And oh, I forgot, her gall bladder was injured in the wreck and had to be removed. It was only 5 times regular size and she had to stay extra days in the hospital. Now we are looking for bladder and kidney damage from the wreck. Today we see Dr. Pannocchia to make arrangements for pelvic/abdominal reconstruction/hemia surgery caused by the wreck.

But . . . Good news! She can go to the bathroom alone and best of all is walking with a walker . . . She says the walker is temporary.

She lost her mama in January and that hurt her deeply, and my mama died April 21st.

We are a long way from being back to normal and we need your prayers and I know Johnnie would love hearing from you.
