Heart Guide for Food Shoppers from the American Heart Association

HeartGuide is an extensive public nutrition education program administered by the American Heart Association to help improve the way Americans buy, prepare, and consume food. The consumer is taught more about food and how to enjoy all foods in proper balance and moderation. The program is paid for by participating food companies.

Certain foods participating in the program will be identified with a heart and check seal on the package labels. This means that these foods have been tested and approved for meeting the HeartGuide standard for total fat, saturated fat, cholesterol, and sodium.

The HeartGuide is a convenient shopping tool to select foods that can be part of a healthful diet. This does not mean that only approved foods are "good."

The foods that will receive the seal first include margarines and spreads, shortenings and oils, canned and frozen vegetables, and crackers. As the program grows, other food products will be added to provide a variety of approved products to consumers.

The American Heart Association HeartGuide program is not a cure or remedy for heart disease. The foods are part of a balanced diet and should not be confused with products that treat heart and blood vessel disease.

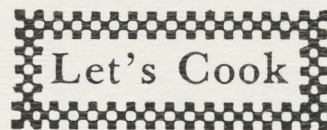

What will the next 15 years bring? Just wait and see!

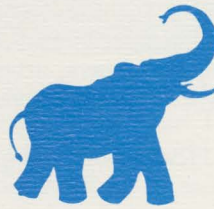
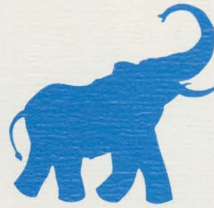
