Bowmans Were Early Settlers

The Bowman name can be traced back to the first settlers of Mount Airy according to Roy O. Bowman of Makilteo, Washington. Bowman, an inventor, was born in Carroll County, Virginia, and moved to Mount Airy in 1922.

Recently Bowman was visiting in Mount Airy and had with a Bicentennial flag which depicted the Bowman and the Bowman coat-of-arms. He explained that the Bowmans were among the first settlers in this area and that his grandfather John was an officer in the Union Army. His grandfather settled in Carroll County on the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Area relative and descendants include Lum, Billy, Ruth, Issie, Lucy, and Ellis Bowman. Mrs. Coy Clifton, Mrs. Dan McMillian, and Scott Bowman are brother and sisters.

Bowman, retired, now spends his time inventing and uses as his trademark a man pulling a bow. He has devoted much time to the re-establishment of the chestnut tree which was destroyed by a blight many years ago. He has been instrumental in shipping thousands of chestnuts to various parts of the United States.

Other Bowmans he has traced throughout the U. S. include Kit Carson's sister, one of the founders of the Boeing Aircraft Company, some of the bush pilots in Alaska, and the

owner of one of the largest dairy companies in the midwest.

In addition to being a former Mount Airy commissioner, Bowman was a retired Mount Airy postmaster and a past company commander of the Mount Airy National Guard unit, serving with the rank of captain.

He was also a past exalted ruler of the Mount Airy Elks Lodge, a past president of the Mount Airy Lions Club, was a former Mount Airy Jaycee and member of the Sertoma Club and a past member of the U.C. Civil Service Examiners.

He was a past chairman of the Surry County chapter, American Red Cross, a past president of the Mount Airy Country Club and was a past assistant scoutmaster for the Boy Scouts of America. He was a member of Granite Masonic Lodge and the Surry Shrine Club.




